Management Discussion of Fund Performance

June 3, 2019

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments during the period ended March 31, 2019, that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook. If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period from inception to the end of the fiscal period. For information on the Fund's longer-term performance, as applicable, please refer to the *Past Performance* section of the report. In this report, "Mackenzie" refers to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks capital growth and income by investing primarily in a combination of equities and fixed income securities of issuers located anywhere in the world. Depending on economic conditions and relative valuations by the Fund's portfolio managers, the Fund will generally invest 30% to 70% of its assets in each of equity and fixed income securities, but may invest up to 100% of its assets in either asset class. The Fund follows an approach to investing that focuses on sustainable and responsible issuers.

Risk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for medium-term investors looking for a global balanced fund that invests in companies focused on socially responsible investing to hold as part of their portfolio, who can handle the volatility of stock and bond markets, and who have a low to medium tolerance for risk.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of the Fund's Series A securities is discussed below. The performance of all series is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Where series returns differ, it is primarily because different levels of fees and expenses were charged to each series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series.

During the year, the Fund's Series A securities returned 2.0% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of 5.4% for a blended index composed of a 50% weighting in the Fund's broad-based index, the MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index (returned 6.5%), and a 50% weighting in the ICE BofAML Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index (returned 4.1%). All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Global economic data weakened throughout the second half of the year. Europe struggled with weakening economic data and continued political challenges affecting the European Union, including negotiations over the withdrawal of the United Kingdom. Chinese equities declined due to trade disputes and a slowing economy. Emerging markets were weighed down by higher U.S. interest rates and a strengthening U.S. dollar. After some volatility, global markets recovered strongly starting in January.

Within the MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index, Qatar, New Zealand and Israel were the strongest performers in Canadian dollar terms, while Turkey, Pakistan and Greece were the weakest. From a sector perspective, utilities, information technology and real estate were the strongest performers, while financials, materials and industrials were the weakest.

Performance varied across developed global sovereign bond markets. In general, yields on longer-term bonds declined and yield curves flattened as central banks took a more pessimistic view of growth as the year progressed. Emerging markets stabilized in January after the U.S. Federal Reserve shifted away from monetary tightening, introducing some uncertainty about the strength of the U.S. dollar. Despite volatility, the Canadian dollar was relatively strong, benefiting from a solid economic backdrop.

The Fund underperformed the broad-based index because of its allocation to fixed income, which underperformed equities. The equity portion of the Fund also underperformed the broad-based index. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the blended index is a more meaningful comparison. The Fund underperformed the blended index, with its fixed income portfolio detracting from performance.

Within the equity portion of the Fund, stock selection in the financials, industrials and materials sectors detracted from performance. From a geographic perspective, stock selection in France and the Netherlands detracted. Conversely, stock selection in the consumer discretionary and information technology sectors contributed to performance, as did stock selection in Switzerland, South Korea and China.

Within the fixed income portion of the Fund, shorter duration positioning relative to the ICE BofAML Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index detracted from performance, as did security selection within government bonds. Conversely, security selection within corporate bonds and exposure to term loans contributed.

The Fund substantially hedged the foreign currency exposure of its fixed income holdings, which detracted from absolute performance primarily as the U.S. dollar appreciated relative to the Canadian dollar.

The Fund used short futures to manage duration in specific markets, which detracted from performance. Currency options, held tactically to gain exposure to currency markets, contributed to performance.

Over the year, portfolio activity and market effect resulted in decreased exposure to fixed income. Exposure to France increased and exposure to Switzerland was introduced, while exposure to Canada, the United Kingdom and Japan decreased. Within the equity portion of the Fund, exposure to the communication services and energy sectors increased, and exposure to real estate was introduced. Exposure to information technology and consumer discretionary decreased. Within the fixed income portion of the

Fund, exposure to foreign government bonds increased, while exposure to corporate bonds decreased and exposure to supra-national bonds was eliminated.

Effective October 1, 2018, the definition of equity sectors under the Global Industry Classification Standards changed. The new communication services sector encompasses the previous telecommunication services sector and the media industry, which was previously included in consumer discretionary. Communication services also includes internet companies that were previously in the information technology sector. Internet retailers and e-commerce companies were reclassified from information technology to consumer discretionary.

Net Assets

The Fund's NAV increased by 4.4% to \$22.4 million at March 31, 2019, from \$21.5 million at March 31, 2018. This change was composed primarily of \$0.5 million in net income (including dividend and interest income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, \$0.5 million in net sales, and \$0.1 million in cash distributions.

See *Other Related Party Transactions* for the percentage of the Fund's NAV owned by related parties. As a result of these investments, the Fund is subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors.

Fees and Expenses

The management expense ratio ("MER") for Series A of 2.37% during the year ended March 31, 2019, was slightly higher than the annualized MER of 2.36% for the period ended March 31, 2018. The MERs (before and after waivers or absorptions, if any) for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report. The MERs for certain series decreased due to a decrease in the management and/or administration fee rates effective June 1, 2018, as noted in the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of the report. The MER for Series PW also decreased due to a decrease in fund costs.

Recent Developments

The equity portfolio management team expects U.S. economic growth to recover somewhat but remain modest by historical standards. The team does not foresee a recession this year but is remaining vigilant for potential signs. After the significant equity rally that started in January, the team believes that a more neutral stance to risk is now warranted. Economic growth expectations are already very low in Europe, leaving room for unexpected positive developments. In the team's opinion, the United Kingdom will not leave the European Union without an agreement, but the failure to resolve the issue continues to weigh on the country's economy.

In the fixed income portfolio management team's view, unless U.S. domestic growth and markets rise significantly, the Federal Reserve is unlikely to raise rates until 2020. Despite the Federal Reserve's change in outlook, the team expects economic activity to pick up. The team believes the European Central Bank and the Bank of Japan will keep monetary conditions accommodative as confidence in their respective economies falters.

Effective June 1, 2018, Series PWF securities were consolidated into Series F securities, Series PWF5 securities were consolidated into Series F5 securities, and Series PWF8 securities were consolidated into Series F8 securities.

Related Party Transactions

The following arrangements result in fees paid by the Fund to Mackenzie or to companies affiliated with the Fund.

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to Mackenzie at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, Mackenzie pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

Other Related Party Transactions

At March 31, 2019, Mackenzie had an investment of \$3.5 million in the Fund (15.5% of the Fund's NAV). If Mackenzie decides to redeem its investment, it will do so in a manner that reduces the possibility of adverse effects on the Fund.

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions.

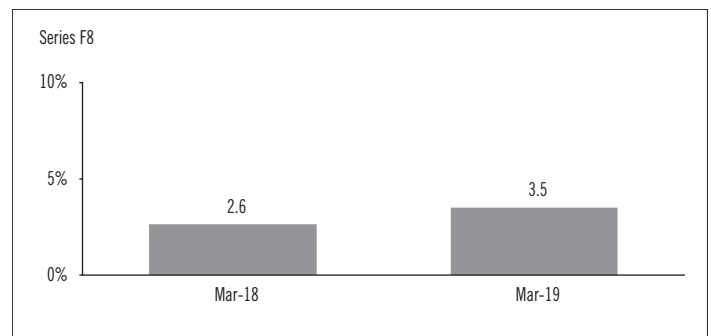
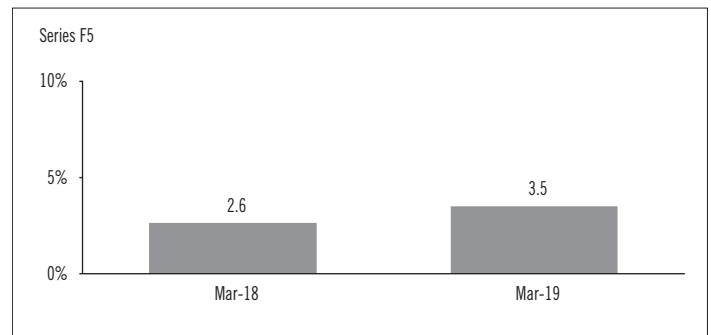
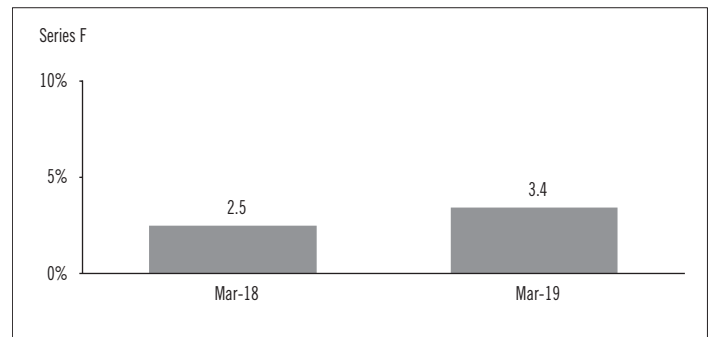
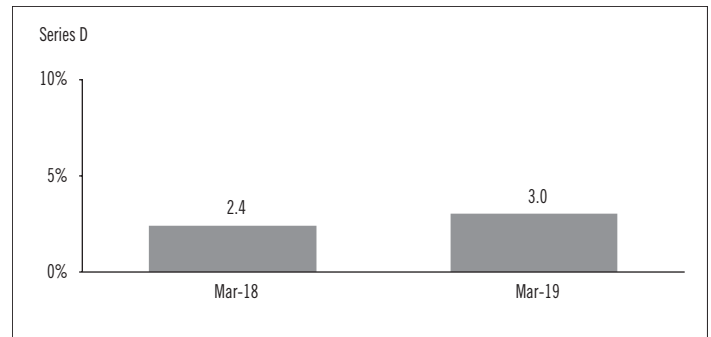
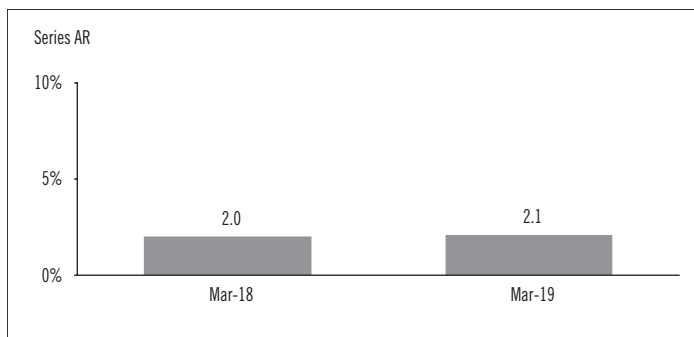
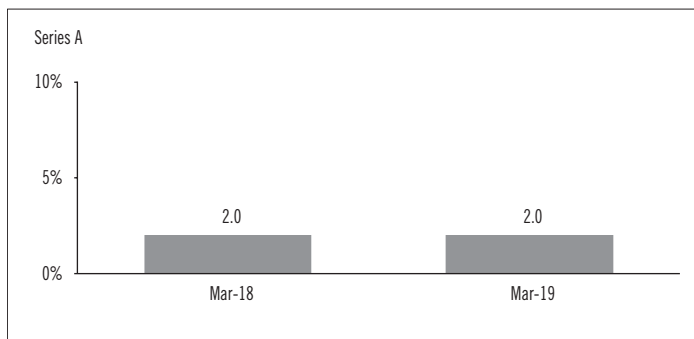
Past Performance

The blended index was composed of 50% MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index and 50% ICE BofAML Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index.

The MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index is a free float adjusted, market capitalization weighted index that is designed to measure the equity market performance of developed and emerging markets. The index consists of 23 developed and 24 emerging market country indices. Net total returns are after the deduction of withholding tax from the foreign income and dividends of its constituents.

The ICE BofAML Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index tracks the performance of investment grade debt publicly issued in the major domestic and eurobond markets, including sovereign, quasi-government, corporate, securitized and collateralized securities. Qualifying bonds must be rated "BBB" or higher and have a remaining term to maturity of at least one year. The foreign currency exposure is hedged back to the Canadian dollar.

- (2) The return since inception for each series will differ when the inception date differs and is only provided when a series has been active for a period of less than 10 years.
- (3) The return of the blended index since inception for each series is 5.8%.

Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by Mackenzie to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. Mackenzie also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with Mackenzie may be entitled to distribution-related payments from Mackenzie on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: IPC Securities Corporation, Investors Group Securities Inc., IPC Investment Corporation and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

Mackenzie used approximately 43% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the year to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 42% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the year. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series.

Series FB and Series FB5 securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Investors in Series FB5 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

Series O securities are offered only to investors investing a minimum of \$500,000 who are enrolled in Mackenzie Portfolio Architecture Service or Open Architecture Service; certain institutional investors; and certain qualifying employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries.

Series PW, Series PWT5 and Series PWT8 securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors in Series PWT5 and Series PWT8 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% or 8% per year, respectively.

Series PWFB and Series PWFB5 securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Investors in Series PWFB5 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

Series PWR securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000 in a Registered Disability Savings Plan offered by Mackenzie.

Series PWX and Series PWX8 securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Investors in Series PWX8 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 8% per year.

Series PWF, Series PWF5 and Series PWF8 securities are no longer available for sale. Effective June 1, 2018, Series PWF, Series PWF5 and Series PWF8 securities were consolidated into Series F, Series F5 and Series F8 securities, respectively.

An investor in the Fund may choose among different purchase options that are available under each series. These purchase options are a sales charge purchase option, a redemption charge purchase option and various low-load purchase options. The charges under the sales charge purchase option are negotiated by investors with their dealers. The charges under the redemption charge and low-load purchase options are paid to Mackenzie if an investor redeems securities of the Fund during specific periods. Not all purchase options are available under each series of the Fund, and the charges for each purchase option may vary among the different series.
